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I called the Attorney Goneral at his home and advised him of the newsflash announcing that the Fresident and Governor Connally of Texas had been shot in Lallas, today, while touring Dallas in an open car, and that the first newsflash indicated the shot was believed to be fatal. The Attorney General had not previously been advised of this.

I asked the Attorney General If there was anything we could do at Unlins. He asked that we do whatever we could, and I told him we would get in touch with the Secret Service there.

1:48 p.m.

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BAC Shanklin called from Pallas. Mr. Shanklin advised that the only information the Lelins Office had was from the redio. According to the radio in Dallas, the freshent and the Governor were shot at the corner of Elm and Commerce Streets in a motor parade going out to the, place where they were to aprak. One witness said a Negro man leaned out a window and made two shots, and the police have the whole building surrounded. The Fresident and the Governor had been taken to Farkland flospital and the President was bleeding from the head.

I instructed BAC Shanklin to get in touch with the Secret Service and offer assistance. Jir. Shanklin stated he had already done so. Jalso told Air. 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1.1, I inquired as to the Governor's condition and Mr. Shanklin Indicated they had not reported on this. I inquired about the Vice President and Mr. Shanklin said the Vice President was in the parade but in a different car. Alter and a start and the second

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56 SAC Shanklin called again and stated the President was in very poor condition but not dead. He said they had called in two priests.

Air. Shanklin related that the shots came from the fourth floor. He stated the Dallas Office is unintaining liaison and has offered . ---assistance. They do not know whether the shots were fired by a white person or a colored person. The first story was that a colored man leaned out of a window but they do not know; they are searching the whole and a second bullding.

Mr. Shanklin advised that the Governor had been taken to an emergency operating room and the Fresident was in the general energency room. The last report was that the Fresident was in very, very critical condition but was still alive.

Mr. Shanklin inquired if the Altorney General or anyone whom they should meet would be coming to Dallas. I advised hir. Shanklin I would let him know if the Attorney General decided to travel to Pallas.

Mr. Fhanklin advised he had just received word the Fresident was shot with a Winchester rills.

I called the Attorney General to advise him that the President was in very, very critical condition. The Attorney General then told me the Freeldent had died. -

I advised the Altorney General that the Governor was in very Berlous condition; that Airs. Kennedy was not hurt and neither was Mrs. Connally.

I told the Attorney General that the shot came from the fourth floor of a building and the ballding was completely surrounded now. E. ... further advised him the Freeident was shot by a Winchester sille. I stated the Callas Office is working in every way to help the Secret Fervice and local pollos.

I inquired if the Attorney General intended to go to Fallas and he stated he did not know exactly what he would do. I told him, if he decided to go down, to let sie know and our office would meet him.

2:17 p.m.

GAC Shanklin called and advised that the doctor had just told our Agents that President Kennedy had just diod. They said this was not being put out yet.

I instructed hir. Fhanklin to go all out on this and flud out who did it.

Nr. Shanklin sinted they had located 3 or 4 shalls in the building and the Sherill's Office had picked up one man.

I told Mr. Fhanklin to give every assistance we can there and do everything we possibly can there at the bailding.

Mr. Shanklin stated that a Secret Forvice agent had also been killed. He stated they did not mention that at first but sa Agent at the Folice Department advised that one died. He did not know the name of this Becret Service agent.

Mr. Shartlin mentioned that he was supposed to come in X caday and he would cancel that. I advised him I thought he abould cancel this.

I told Mr. Thenklin that the Attorney General did not know what he was going to do, that he may or may not go to Fallas, but I would let Atr. Shanklin know If the Attorney General decided to go to Fallas.
