I mentioned that one of the Fecret Fervice agents reportedly had been killed, and he stated he did not know this. I told him I had asked the name of the Secret Service Agent killed but it was not known.

I told Mr. Howley that apparently the shooting came from the fourth floor of a building and shells had been found in the building; that these were Winchester shells - apparently a Winchester rille was used; and that the building was surrounded.

Hr. Rowley stuid he was also thinking of subversive elements - Afexico and Cuba. I then mentioned the Elan element. 'I advised Mr. Rowley that one witness stated he saw a Negro man loan out a window but later this was not confirmed and they do not know whether it was a white or a black.
