Enclosed are two copies each of FD-355's recommending incentive awards for SAs [redacted] and [redacted] supplementing the recommendations set out hereafter.

On 2/29/64, [redacted] and [redacted] were installed after midnight. Activation of [redacted] was made on the afternoon of 2/29/64, and [redacted] was activated on the afternoon of 3/2/64. These installations were made after numerous painstaking hours of work and planning. Special care was mandatory in view of the national importance of the subject matter and the constant inquiry by newsmen. Installations were made at 629 Belt Line Road, Richardson, Texas, the home of MARINA OSWALD, wife of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, assassin of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. In addition, the coverage and removal of the installations were very delicate operations, due to the fact the installations were placed at the specific request of the President's Commission and the Attorney General. These installations were requested during the height of national publicity and extreme interest in MARINA OSWALD by newsmen, who represented a large segment of the world press. They were in Dallas at the time, covering the trial of JACK L. HUBY, who was on trial for the murder of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. Constant efforts were being made by news representatives to interview MARINA OSWALD with various and sundry methods employed to locate her for interview.

This entire operation was under my over-all supervision. [redacted] assisted me and was very instrumental in the over-all planning and co-ordination. In addition, [redacted] co-ordinated the physical surveillance and supervised the installations and removals of the MISUR and T&SUR on 2/29/64, and 3/12/64. The installations and surveillance on 2/29/64, and the removals and surveillance on 3/12/64, were co-ordinated in the highest of Bureau traditions with no detection or indication that such installations or activity had been employed.

They were specifically utilized because of their knowledge of the area and their outstanding ability. They exercised ingenuity and good judgment and performed in an over-all outstanding and noteworthy manner. Without the diligent work of these surveillance Agents, it would have been impossible to accomplish the excellent results.

I therefore recommend that letters of commendation be directed to each of the Agents previously mentioned, who participated in these surveillances. I feel that individual letters are warranted in this case because of the extremely delicate nature of the surveillances on an individual of national importance, who was under constant scrutiny of the press and general public. For this reason, I strongly recommend that each receive a personal letter of commendation from the Director.

Each and every participant performed in a noteworthy manner, exercising ingenuity and good judgment in the best of the Bureau's traditions. It is recommended that the letter pay special tribute to their ever-all continuous excellent performance throughout a most trying and difficult assignment of an extremely sensitive nature.

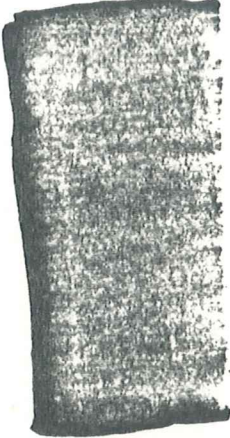

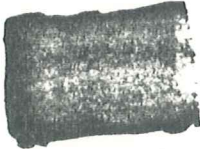

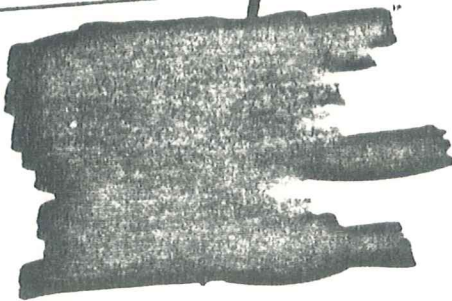
