Dear Mr. Rankin:

There is transmitted herewith copy of a memorandum report dated December 31, 1963, from the Federal Bureau of Investigation concerning Mr. Norman Redlich, a member of the Commission staff.

Access to the report is to be limited to officials of the Commission whose official duties require access to the investigative information. Neither the report nor its contents may be disseminated outside of your agency or outside of the Executive Branch. Since the report contains information that has been classified Confidential, you should of course assure that it will be safeguarded in accordance with the provisions of Executive Order 10501, as amended.
