Your lotter dated March 23, 1034, transmitted specific questions pertaining to the investigation of Lee Harvey Oswald prior to the assassination of President Kennedy and requested a reasoned response to each question.

At the outpet, I wish to explasize that the facts available to the FBT concerning Lee Hervey Govald prior to the assassination did not suggest in any way that he was, or would be, a threat to President Hennedy; nor were they such as to require the FBT to inform the Secret Service of his presence in Ballas or his employment at the Texas School Each Depository.

The Cowald case was one of many thousands of invostigative matters handled by the FEI. During the fiscal year ending June 20, 1960, the FDE handled 620,071 investigative matters in the criminal, civil and socurity fields. The extent, depth and urgency of each investigation necessarily is dependent on the available facts in the case. A file concerning Cswald was opened at the time newspapers reported his defoction to Rescia in 1959 for the purpose of correlating information inacratch as he was considered a pescible security rick in the event he returned to this country. When we learned in 1960 that his nother was sending him money, we interviewed her find his brother, Robert Cowald, to determine the reason. Arain in 1060 investigation was conducted to dotorning if he was in Switzerland as we wore advised he contemplated enrolling in a college there. The investigation was re-instituted at the time of his roturn to the United States in 1962, and he was interviewed on two occasions in 1983 in an effort to ascortain if he had been recruited by the Soviet intelligence corvices

The investigation was continued in 1983 when it was reported that Gayald had corresponded with "The Worker," an east const communist newspaper, and it was also reported he was engaged in activities on brhalf of the fair Play for Cuba Conmittee (FRCC). This investigation was in progress when he was reported in October, 1960, to be in contact with the Soviet Embassy in Merico, and on Hovember 18, 1963, in contact with the Soviet Embassy in Fashington, D. C. The purpose of the investigation was to determine the extent of his activities on behalf of the FPCC and the reasons for his contacts with the Soviet Embassies.

In short, Gevald had gone to the Soviet Union at the age of minotoon and attempted to renounce his American citizenship. He had recented; his passport had been returned to his and he had been permitted by the Lepertmont of State to return to the United Ginton as an American citizen. After bis return, he had subscribed to "The Worker," had distributed pumphlets for the EPCC and had admitted publicly that he was a Harrist. He had been in contact with the Soviet Eablery in Vashington, D. C. ; and it was reported, but not confirmed, that he had been in contact with the Soviet Labasay in Maxico. The reason for his contacts with the Soviet Debarries was possibly to obtain visas to re-enter the Soviet Union. As proviously indicated, his activities as known at the time of the accessibation did not suggest in any way that he was a dangerous subversive; that he was vielating any Federal law; or that he represented a threat to the personal safety of the Provident. There was no basis for the FEI to keep him under constant observation. In the absonce of any information showing Ourald to be a possible threat to the President, there was no basis to inform the Secret Earvice concerning Oswald's presence or employment in (5) u Dollas, Texag. add ?
