He advised that the Immigration Service had processed her papers at the time of her entrance into the United States. He advised her that the Immigration Service . could assure her residence in the United States and eventual citizenship if she so desired and qualified under the law if she would cooperate with Federal officials in the finding out of the facts attendant to the investigation concerning her former husband and the investigation of the assassination of the President of the United States. ٠٠ الم MARINA wanted to know what cooperation meant and she was told by Mr. HARVEY that it meant she would be questioned by Federal officials, and it would be expected that she would give truthful answers to questions pertinent to this investigation and that she would furnishall information in her possession concerning the investigation and concerning herself. MARINA agreed that she would cooperate and expressed her appreciation to Mr. HARVEY for his assurances.

An interview of MARINA, pertinent to the investigation of OSWALD and the assassination, was thereafter conducted on 11/28/63 by SAS HEITMAN and BOGUSLAV. Mr. HARVEY was not present during this portion of the interview. The results of this portion of the interview are contained in a 302 dated 11/29/63, (See page 546 of report of SA WARREN C. DE BRUEYS dated at Dallas, 12/2/63, captioned "LEE HARVEY OSWALD, aka, IS-R-CUBA").

It will be noted MARINA OSWALD was not completely cooperative in subsequent interviews as is recorded in 302's forwarded to the Bureau. I have been informed by SA HEITHAN that MARINA was at no time threatened directly or by innuendo with expulsion or deportation from this country, if she did not cooperate or answer the questions which were asked her. immigration status in the United States had been discussed with her by Mr. HARVEY and she stated she understood her status. All interviews with MARINA OSWALD were conducted in a polite, business-like manner.
