SUBJECT: LEE HARVEY OSWALD
ISR - CUBA

I have reviewed the portions of Mrs. OSWALD's testimony, as provided on pp. 79,80, of Vol. I, of the "Hearings Before the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy."

I wish to emphatically state that I or no FBI representative in my presence or to my knowledge under any circumstances took a position with Mrs. OSWALD that if she did not answer questions or cooperate she could not stay in the United States or in this country.

At all times during the interrogation of Mrs. OSWALD a business-like, polite approach was taken by me and by SA WALLACE R. HEITMAN when we talked with Mrs. OSWALD.

Her status in this country was discussed with Mrs. OSWALD by FRED HARVEY of the Immigration and Naturalization Service with SA BOGUSLAV serving only as an interpreter. SA WALLACE HEITMAN was present. This occurred to the best of my recollection in the last week of November, 1963.

No questions posed by Immigration and Naturalization Service, as interpreted by me, could be classified as threatening her with expulsion or deportation if she did not cooperate.
