We would like to have additional information concerning Mr. Norman Redlick, who is on the Warren Commission investigating the assassination of President Kennedy.

According to John Cousten Curry's article in the Daily Oklahoman of February 17th, this Norman Redlick is on the executive committee of the "Emergency Civil Liberties Committee". This committee has been described as a "front for the communist party" by our own House Committee on Un-American Activities.

Is this accusation true? If Redlick is a member of such an organization, why is he allowed to serve on the Warren Commission?

Why should the Reds know Mrs. Oswald's testimony when the same information is denied the American people?

What can we as interested American citizens do to correct such a dangerous practice, both in this particular case and in any future similar event?
