Warren's Aide Grows Redder

Communist Ties Revealed Of Assassination Group Legal Consultant

WASHINGTON, May 6 (AP)—
Official sources Wednesday re-
vealed additional information
about the Communist associa-
tions of Norman Redlich, the
Warren Commission's \$100-a-
day legal consultant.

Members of Congress have
asked the commission, headed
by Chief Justice Earl Warren,
to fire the 38-year-old New
Yorker since his membership
in organizations cited as Com-
munist-controlled has become
known.

Within recent days it has be-
come known that he is a mem-
ber of the Emergency Civil
Liberties Committee, the Na-
tional Committee to Abolish
the House Un-American Activi-
ties Committee and the Youth
Committee to Abolish the
House Un-American Activities
Committee.

The Warren Commission is
investigating President Ken-
nedy's assassination, including
rumors that his death was the
result of either a right-wing or
Communist plot.

Additional details disclosed
Wednesday about Redlich's
past activities and associations
included:

That he was one of the signers
of a leaflet distributed in No-
vember by the permanent
student committee for travel
to Cuba which supported the
defiance by 59 Americans,
mostly students, of a State
Department ban on travel to
Cuba.

One of the 59 Americans
Phillip Luce, a student is
employed by the Emergency
Civil Liberties Committee
which has been cited as Com-
munist controlled. Redlich is
a national councilman of the
committee.

Redlich and others signed an
April 13 newspaper adver-
tisement condemning the
House Un-American Activi-
ties Committee. Another
signer was Waldo Frank
one of the original organizers of
the fair play for Cuba com-
mittee, which has been cited
as a Communist front by the
Senate Internal Security sub-
committee.

Other signers of the April 13
advertisement included per-
sons who have invoked the
protection of the Fifth
Amendment rather than an-
swer questions about their
Communist connections.
Redlich was attorney for Har-
ry Magdoff, who invoked the
Fifth Amendment May 23,
1961, when asked about his
Communist ties. Magdoff was
identified in July, 1948, as a
Communist.

Redlich was among 25 law pro-
fessors who signed a state-
ment disagreeing with a Su-
preme Court decision requir-
ing the Communist Party,
U.S.A., to register with the
Subversive Activities Con-
trol Board.

Redlich has made speeches
and signed statements urg-
ing abolition of the House
Un-American Activities Com-
mittee, a favorite target of
Communists.

He has been associated with
appeals for clemency for
Carl Braden and Frank Wil-
kinson, both publicly as-
sociated with the Communist
movement.
