I have received information that a NORMAN

REDLICH, has been appointed to the Warren Council, which is investigating the death of Mr. Kennedy. I understand that REDLICH is a personal assistant to the top counsel of that commission.

Tell me if you will, is this REDLICH an associate professor of law at N. Y. U. Law School?

And on April 16, 1955 did REDLICH act as a speaker for the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee in New York City?

Has the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee been cited by our House Committee on Un-American Activities as a Communist front?

In December of 1961, was REDLICH among speakers appearing at a rally in New York sponsored by the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee?

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Committee on Un-American Activities?

And, Mr. Hanne, didn't that same organization circulate a letter six months later appealing for money + funds to help elect Congressmen pledged to vote for abolition of the House Committee?

Was REDLICH also listed on the list as a member of its advisory committee of the New York Council?

Now, did REDLICH also sign an announcement on June 24, 1962, pertaining to Supreme Court Justice Black's dissent on the McClellan Decision; re: the registration of communists?

And in November, 1963, did REDLICH or was he listed in support of a statement contained in a leaflet distributed by the Permanent Student Committee for Travel in Cuba which defended the DEFIANCE of 59 idiotic Americans, who traveled to Cuba against the wishes of their government?

Has, or did REDLICH signed a petition urging clemency in the cases of Carl BRADEN + Frank WILKINSON? (1962)

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Do the records of the House Committee on Un-American Activities show that REDLICH once was counsel for a Harry MAG DOFF before that committee on May 31, 1951.

Who's Harry MAG DOFF?

Correct me if I'm wrong, but didn't Elizabeth Bentley, a confessed former espionage agent, testify before the House Committee in July, 1948, that Harry MAG DOFF was a member of the Soviet espionage group which had been active in Washington in the early 1940's?

If I complained to someone about REDLICH being on the Warren Commission, who would I complain to?

Is it really in the best interest of the commission to have such a man around? I think not.
