Congressman K.W. Stinson, my representative from the 7th District of Washington, in his latest newsletter reports that he has written you concerning Mr. Norman Redlich, a member of the staff of the commission investigating the assassination of President Kennedy. Mr. Stinson asks for his dismissal on the basis of his membership in an alleged Communist front organization, the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee.

I do not know Mr. Redlich, nor do I know the goals or activities of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee. However, I do know that Mr. Redlich's value as a member of your staff cannot be determined from an analysis of the organization letterheads his name appears upon. I urge you to disregard Mr. Stinson's request.
