WASHINGTON: The Mexican president Jose Lopez Portillo offered Tuesday to help the United States and Cuba restore diplomatic relations, but said Washington and Havana seem ready to take that step on their own. In a speech to the National Press Club, Lopez said Mexico believes the United States and Cuba must have healthy relations and Mexico which has diplomatic relations with Cuba and would bepleased to act as intermediary. Washington and Hawana broke relations in 1961. He also urged the United States to restore full sovereign and national dignity to Panana by negotiating a new canal treaty acceptable to the Latin American nation. President Carter has already dispatched his negotiator on that project. Lopez earlier conferred more than an hour with Carter, the second and last round of neetings in a visit that seemed to designed restore and harmony to U.S.- Mexican relations. PHILADELPHIA: The Evening Bulletin was on the streets again Tuesday, after the newspaper guild in the second week of a strike, the rival Philadelphia Inquiror and Daily News ordered the pickets withdrawn, to allow union nenbers to report for work under court orders.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

LONDON: Foreign Secretary Anthony Crossland 58 is in a coma from a stroke and sinking fast, his personnel assistant said Tuesday. Political sources said even if he survives, he will not be able to resume his duties.

VANCE BEGINS ETDDLE EAST TOUR.

JERUSALEM: Secretary of State Cyrus Vance arrived in Israel Tuesday on his first overseas mission, and said, the United States is deeply committed to the survival of Israel and its values. Israel Foreign Minister Yigal Allon who greeted Vance said, his first trip to the Middle East was a signal to revive the region's political nomentum and begin noves for peace. A newspaper in Kuwait reported, Vance's visits to all the Arab nations surrounding Israel will include a meeting Friday with the Palestine Liberation Organization Chief Yasser Arafat. There was no immediate confirmation from the U.S. party. Vance said, he came to the Middle East with one the message that the United States is confineed of a fundamental underlying principle. that the Whited States is confinced of a fundamental underlying principle in the search for peace which is enduring trust and confidence between the two nations. During the flight from Washington officials aboard Vance's jet said, the Secretary brought with him no specific U.S. proposal on renewed Middle East peace talks, which have been stalemated on the question of Palestinian representation at the same table with Israel.
