CARTER TO ISSUE NUCLEAR ENERGY POLICY, WASHINGTON (UPI):

President Carter within the next few days will issue a policy statement on uranium and plutonium, and make decision on several possible arms sales abroad, according to his spokesman. White House Press Secretary Jody Powell also suggested, that the Carter administration will not soften its stand on human rights even at the expense of progress in preliminary arms talks with the Soviet Union. Energy adviser, James Schlesinger said during the weekend the Administration oppose development of plutonium fuel systems on grounds, that plutonium is a key ingredient in nuclear weapons. Schlesinger said, Carter favors construction of more conventional uranium reactors.

WASHINGTON (UPI): The Supreme Court agreed Monday to decide whether Richard Nixon's privacy would be violated by public distribution of tapes used to convict his closest aides for their part in the Watergate coverup.
