accompany the body to Washington."

If Clark handed the certificate to Buckley, what is the basis for Manchester's dramatic delivery of it as Air Force One was about to take off for Washington? The point may be important.

Apparently a body may not be removed for burial without a death certificate. Clark not only fulfilled a routine function but, according to Manchester, was ready to use force to overcome Rose's opposition to removal of the corpse. His role appears consistent. Manchester's drama implies the body was removed without the necessary death certificate and this technical violation of law was repaired at the last moment. The joint needs clarification, Manchester wrapped it in confusion
