Hundreds visit JFK assassination site

Encouraged by warm weather and the long Thanksgiving weekend — and perhaps *The News*' report of a new look at the murder of President John Kennedy — hundreds of people visited the John F. Kennedy assassination site downtown Sunday.

They came from places as far away as Brazil and the Rio Grande Valley. People scanned the former Texas School Book

Depository, many took pictures, and some debated *The News*' exclusive story Sunday on an enhanced film that may show two persons in the 6th-floor window minutes before the presidential motorcade passed.

"I believe there was more than one person involved in the assassination and more than one person here with a weapon," said a 28-year-old man who recently moved to Dallas from Indiana. "The House Assassina-

tions Committee raised more questions than it answered."

One woman said, "I wonder why it took so long to come out," referring to the film Robert J. Groden enhanced, subsequently finding possibly two figures at the window.

But a Fort Worth resident — who brought relatives to see the site — said of the assassination, "I think they ought to leave it alone. I think they got the man."
