As we have informed you, we have been unable to locate a copy of the particular copy of the pamphlet, "The Crime Against Cuba," obtained by Special Agent John L. Quigley from Lee Harvey Oswald, among the records of the Warren Commission. If the Department of Justice will furnish us a copy of any transmittal letter or correspondence concerning the transmittal of a copy of the Quigley copy of the pamphlet to the Commission, we shall be pleased to make a further search. We are sending copies of your letter of July 25, 1969 and of our reply to the Special Assistant to the Deputy Attorney General, Mr. R. Richards Rolapp.

Commission Document 555 has only 95 pages rather than 96 as indicated in your letter. An examination of the pertinent records of the Commission has disclosed no interviews or other information for Jack W. Martin, of Goldonna, Louisiana, other than that in CD 87.

Your list of records of which you request copies includes the memorandum of transfer referred to in the Report of the 1968 Panel Review of Photographs, X-ray Films, Documents and Other Evidence Pertaining to the Fatal Wounding of President John F. Kennedy on November 22, 1963, in Dallas, Texas. Although left at the National Archives building for safekeeping, that memorandum is a private paper which is not the property of the United States. It belongs to the Kennedy family, and requests for permission to see it should be made to Honorable Burke Marshall, Old Orchard Road, Armonk, New York 10504.

The microfilm copies of other documents you ordered will be mailed to ou as soon as they are ready.
