Your list of records on which you request copies includes the memorandum of transfer referred in the Report or the 1968 Panel Review of Photographs, X-ray Films, Documents end Other Evidence Pertaining to the Fatal Wounding of President Ion kennedy on November 22, 1963, in Dallas, Texas. Althouzif left at the National Archives building for safekeeping, that memocenaum is a private paper which is not the property of the United aGitates. It belongs to the Kennedy family, and requests for permission to see it should be made to Honorable Burke Marshall, Olderchard Road, Armonk, New York 10504.

The microfilm copies of other documents you ordered will be mailed to Dou as soon as they are ready.
