CHICAGO - (AP) - A suit charging the National Archives in Washington with suppressing documents concerning an alleged plot to

a s s a s s inate the late President John P. Kennedy in Chicago was filed Monday in U.S. District Court.

filed by legal researcher Sherman Skolnick, contends the archives are withholding information that shows Kenmedia albeit mot die die diesiels of a lone assussin but as the result of a conspiracy.

Radio station WCFL 2 Metromedia affiliate owned by the Chicago Federation of Labor and Industrial Union Council, which sired the story before the suit was filed and worked with Skoluick in its preparation, said the suit "is believed to be the first in the nation challenging the authority of the archives to withhold information about the Kennedy death for 75 years."

THE WARREN Commission, a panel appointed by then President Lyndon B. Johnson to investigate the essassination, said that Kennedy was killed by a single man, Lee Harvey Oswald, and that it could find no evidence of any conspiracy.

The suit asserts that five conspirators planned to kill Kennedy at the Army-Air Force football game in Chicago Nov. 2, 1963. But when the President canceled his appearance because of a cold at the last minute, the suit continued, the assassination ettempt was rescheduled for Dellas three weeks later.

The suit states that "less than an hour before the president's scheduled arrival," a Chicago lithographer was arrested for a minor traffic violation. It said the man, one of the compresers, also was charged with carrying a conchealed weapon after police noticed a hunting knife on the front seat of the car.

Skolnick contends the lithographer, Thomas Arthur Vallee, "was a double for Lee Hervey Oswald."
