Study Urged for Photos Of JFK's Bullet Wound

NEW YORK, July 8—(UPI)—
The examination of X-rays and
photographs of the late Presi-
dent John F. Kennedy's body
by a committee of scholars and
doctors to back up the Warren
commission's findings was pro-
posed today in the current issue
of The Nation.
An article by Jacob Cohen, a
Yale history teacher - turned
freelance writer, suggested the

examination of the pictures and
X-rays as a way to support the
commission's finding that Lee
Harvey Oswald alone assassi-
nated Mr. Kennedy.
COHEN, who is reportedly
completing a book defending the
commission's conclusion, said
between 15 and 20 photographs
and 25 to 32 X-rays had been
taken.
He said they could show

whether a wound in Mr. Ken-
nedy's back had been high
enough to sustain the commis-
sion's theory that a single bul-
let wounded both the President
and Texas Gov. John B. Con-
nally.
Cohen also contended they
could reject suggestions a sec-
ond assassin might have shot
the President from the front
or side.
