Would Have Photos Of JFK's Body Examined

NEW YORK (UPI) — The examination of X-rays and photographs of the late President John F. Kennedy's body by a committee of scholars and doctors to back up the Warren Commission's findings was proposed Thursday in the current issue of The Nation.

An article by Jacob Cohen, a Yale history teacher-turned freelance writer, suggested the examination of the pictures and X-rays as a way to support the commission's finding that Lee Harvey Oswald alone assassinated Kennedy.

Cohen, who is reportedly com-

pleting a book defending the commission's conclusion, said between 15 and 20 photographs and 25 to 32 X-rays had been taken.

He said they could show whether a wound in Kennedy's back had been high enough to sustain the commission's theory that a single bullet wounded both the President and Texas Gov. John B. Connally.

Cohen also contended they could reject suggestions a second assassin might have shot the President from the front or side.
