One question was how the President could have received a bullet in the front of the throat from a rifle in the Texas School Book Depository Building after his car had passed the building and was turning a the building and was turning a gentle curve away from it. One explanation from a competent source was that the President had turned to his right to had turned to his right to wave and was struck at that moment.
