

On 11/21/63 the radio equipment was checked, also 4 walkie-talkies, to ensure perfect working order on 11/22/63.

Five persons at the Trade Mart, including anti-JFK pickets, were arrested after the shots at Dealey Plaza and charged with conspiracy to commit murder, later changed to trespassing.

Lt. Col. George Whitmeyer of US Army was in pilot car with Lumpkin; pilot car riders were supposed to watch for trouble including observation of buildings.

Pilot car departed Love Field, maintained 1/4 mile or 3 minutes distance from motorcade. Lumpkin stopped at Houston and Elm to notify the traffic officer that the motorcade was 2 or 3 minutes behind.

A record was made of all persons in cars on parking lot behind the TSBD (names, phones, addresses and place of work). Cars not removed were checked later in the afternoon for license numbers.

Lumpkin told Revill to take a team of men and systematically search the 6th floor, starting from the east wall, to the west wall, checking all boxes, crates, books, etc. A "member of the searching party found the rifle" (but no one found the clipboard!).

Pierce Allman got into the building before it was sealed and was allowed to remain. All others including the press were kept out. At 2:45 the press was assembled and allowed to go up to the 6th floor and take photos, to interview Roy Truly briefly.
