- A. Investigation Concerning Ambulance Call to Elm and Houston Streets, Dallas, Texas, by Oneal Incorporated, Funeral Directors, Immediately Prior to Assassination to Take Individual, Believed to Have Suffered Epileptic Seizure, to Hospital

At 10:15 PM, on May 12, 1964, DAN DAWSON, 3206C Hudnall Street, Dallas, Texas, telephonically advised Night Clerk L. JOSEPH HERSLEY at the Dallas Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that he formerly worked for Oneal Inc., Funeral Directors, 3206 Oak Lawn, Dallas, Texas, and on November 22, 1963, he was handling the radio calls at Oneal Inc., Funeral Directors. He stated he received a call requesting an ambulance be sent to the corner of Elm and Houston Streets, Dallas, Texas. He pointed out this was prior to the passing of the Presidential motorcade and near the site where President KENNEDY was assassinated. DAWSON said he dispatched an ambulance to that location and a victim of an epileptic seizure was taken to Parkland Memorial Hospital. While in the process of registering this patient into the hospital, DAWSON stated the patient disappeared.

DAWSON advised he did not know the name of the person picked up by the ambulance but stated the ambulance driver, AUBREY LEE RINE, might have information regarding this.

DAWSON stated he was furnishing this information to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, since he felt it possible that this incident may have been planned to distract attention from the "shooting" that was to follow.
