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Under date of February 4, 1964, the FBI Laboratory furnished the following information concerning an examination requested by the Dallas Office under date of January 30, 1964:

Results of examination:

White cotton dry cleaner's tags have been sewed to the left shirt tail of specimen Q469 and to the left side of specimen Q465. The numerals "03280" appear on tags as well as some additional markings which appear in Russian.

Labels in the collars of specimens Q455 and Q462 have been found to be printing in the Russian language. Neither specimen appears to have been manufactured in the United States.

Specimens Q476 and Q474 boots also have printing in the Russian language stamped to the inside portions indicating they were manufactured in Russia.

The name "W. E. OSWALD" appears on many of the items listed in this submission.

The markings of insignias on the collars of the khaki-colored long-sleeved shirts and the markings on dry cleaning tags are identical items.
