

Under date of September 8, 1964, the FBI Laboratory furnished the following information concerning an examination requested by the Dallas Office on August 28, 1964:

Specimens received August 31, 1964

- D-237 One bus ticket stub issued by Transportes del Norte, # 13688
- D-238 One pamphlet entitled "This Week - Esta Semana" for the period September 28 to October 4, 1963
- D-239 One book with cover torn off entitled "Learning Russian" by NINA POTAPOVA
- D-240 One guide map of Mexico City, folded, published by Editorial Flecha, Mexico, D. F.
- D-241 One pamphlet in English entitled "Fiesta Brava" published by Pemex Travel Club, Mexico, D. F.
- D-242 One library pass in the name of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, dated April, 1962, written in the Russian language

Result of examination:

Specimens D-237 through D-242 were examined cryptanalytically. While submitted specimens or any similar material could conceivably involve code or cipher, on the basis of material and information available for analysis, no valid coded message can be established as being present nor was there any indication that the Russian grammar book containing the alphabetical vocabulary was being used for coding purposes.
