- D-243 One deck of "Aviator" brand playing cards, manufactured by The United States Playing Card Company, Cincinnati, Ohio, containing fifty-two playing cards
- D-244 Envelope addressed to Mrs. MARINA OSWALD and accompanying one-page letter handwritten in the Russian language, dated 16/5/64
- D-245 One-page letter handwritten in the Russian language ending on reverse side with English phrase "P.S. Excuse me for making you wait."
- D-246 Envelope addressed to Mrs. MARINA OSWALD and accompanying one-page letter handwritten in the Russian language, dated 25/02/64
- D-247 Envelope addressed to Mrs. MARINA OSWALD and accompanying one-page letter handwritten in the Russian language, dated 29/10/63
- D-248 Envelope with no postmark or stamp, bearing address "Marina Oswald, Kindness of Irving Police." with return address "Ruth Paine, 2515 W. 5th Street, Irving, Texas," and two accompanying two-page letters in the Russian language
- D-249 Six United States of America Parcel Post Customs Declaration tags, three of which contain the signature "Lee H. Oswald"
- D-250 One Russian - German textbook
