OFEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGA

Mrs. LOIS SITZ, manager and co-owner of the motel "Half Circle J", 9600 West Highway 80, advised that on November 20, 1963, at about midnight a man came into the office and asked to rent a room. She stated that he asked her if she had any coffee which he could take to his room, as he had been drinking heavily and needed the coffee to sober him up. Mrs SITZ stated she had no coffee but advised he could get some coffee at a nearby truck stop. She then showed him Unit 9. She stated she entered Unit 9 first and turned the light on. She stated when she came out of the room he was removing a gun from his car. Mrs. SITZ states this was a pistol, but she cannot tell whether it was an automatic or a revolver. She stated seeing the gun in his hand frightened her, but she said nothing about it.

She stated she returned to the office, and he followed her in. She further stated it was at this time he advised her he had a gun, but it was legitimate as he was with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. She stated he then returned to Unit 9 and assumedly went to bed.

Mrs. SITZ stated this man returned to the office at about 9:00 a.m., November 21, 1963, and turned in the key to Unit 9. She stated he then asked her "What time is the President coming in, and where is he going to stay in Fort Worth?" She states her husband, who was with her at that time, told him the President was to arrive at Carswell Air Force Base, Fort Worth, Texas, at 10:45 p.m. and would be staying at the Hotel Texas She states upon that he left, driving a 1955 Oldsmobile or Chevrolet, which was two-tone red and cream in color. She stated this car bore 1963 New Mexico license 2-80392.

Mrs. SITZ stated the registration card which this man had filled out bears the name, which cannot be definitely made out, but which appears to be "ROBT. E. (last name unidentifiable), 3424 Hayeldran, S.W., Albuquerque, New Mexico."

She stated the card reflects he represented Wahl Shop Company, and that the card also bore the make of the car as a 1955 Chevrolet, bearing 1963 Missouri license 280390.

Mrs. SITZ described this person in the following manner:

Mrs. SITZ thinks this man is possibly identical with the photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, which appeared on Page 5 of the Fort Worth Press bearing date November 23, 1963, as the person who registered at her motel on November 20, 1963, and was subsequently assigned to Unit 9. Mrs. SITZ further states that she could be sure one way or the other of the identity, had the picture of OSWALD, which appeared in the Fort Worth Press, shown him to be wearing a hat.
