Banister, Guy: ex-FBI agent, private detective linked to Cuban exile groups, died heart attack June 1964

Chetta, Dr. Nicholas: coroner who performed Ferrie autopsy

Coffey, Melvin: friend who accompanied Ferrie to Texas 11/22/63

Compton, Thomas: friend of Ferrie from Hammond, La; researcher on addiction

Crouch, Al: interviewed Russo 2/24/67 for Baton Rouge television

Cummings, Raymon: Dallas ex-cabdriver, alleges took Oswald/Ferrie to Ruby Dalzell, Wm: 611 Commerce Street, Dallas, TX 75202
