

KENNEDY:

I KNOW WHO KILLED HIM

MAN has broken a 14-year silence to claim he knows who killed President Kennedy. The assassin, he says, was a Dubliner, Gavin, a former dockworker who took in the Republic of Ireland.

He says a four-man Cuban bander squad led by an Army officer called Alvarez Rodriguez, was sent to Cork in June 1963 during Kennedy's Irish tour.

Their mission was to assassinate him; the men were ordered to follow Kennedy wherever he went. The plot was called off November 22.

The Dublin Mirror newspaper, which is a Kennedy ally, says Mrs. Haverhill has reportedly challenged the official report of Kennedy's death.

Mrs. Hale is a member of A.C. The Assassination Committee for the Struggle.

She has the largest private collection of information on Kennedy outside America, a 200-volume set which she says is the basis for the Sunday Mirror's recent examination of the Kennedy affair.

Plot

Mrs. Hale said of Gavin's claim: "This is the first time anyone has admitted an assassination plot in Ireland."

The plot, she says, was hatched in the early 1960s when the Cuban was a ship's officer.

They met again by chance at a Cork hotel in 1963, and Rodriguez told him of the plot.

Gavin says: "He said Cuba had ordered Kennedy's death because of America's attempts to 'kick him out'."

Two years later, Gavin learned Rodriguez had been killed "because he knew too much."

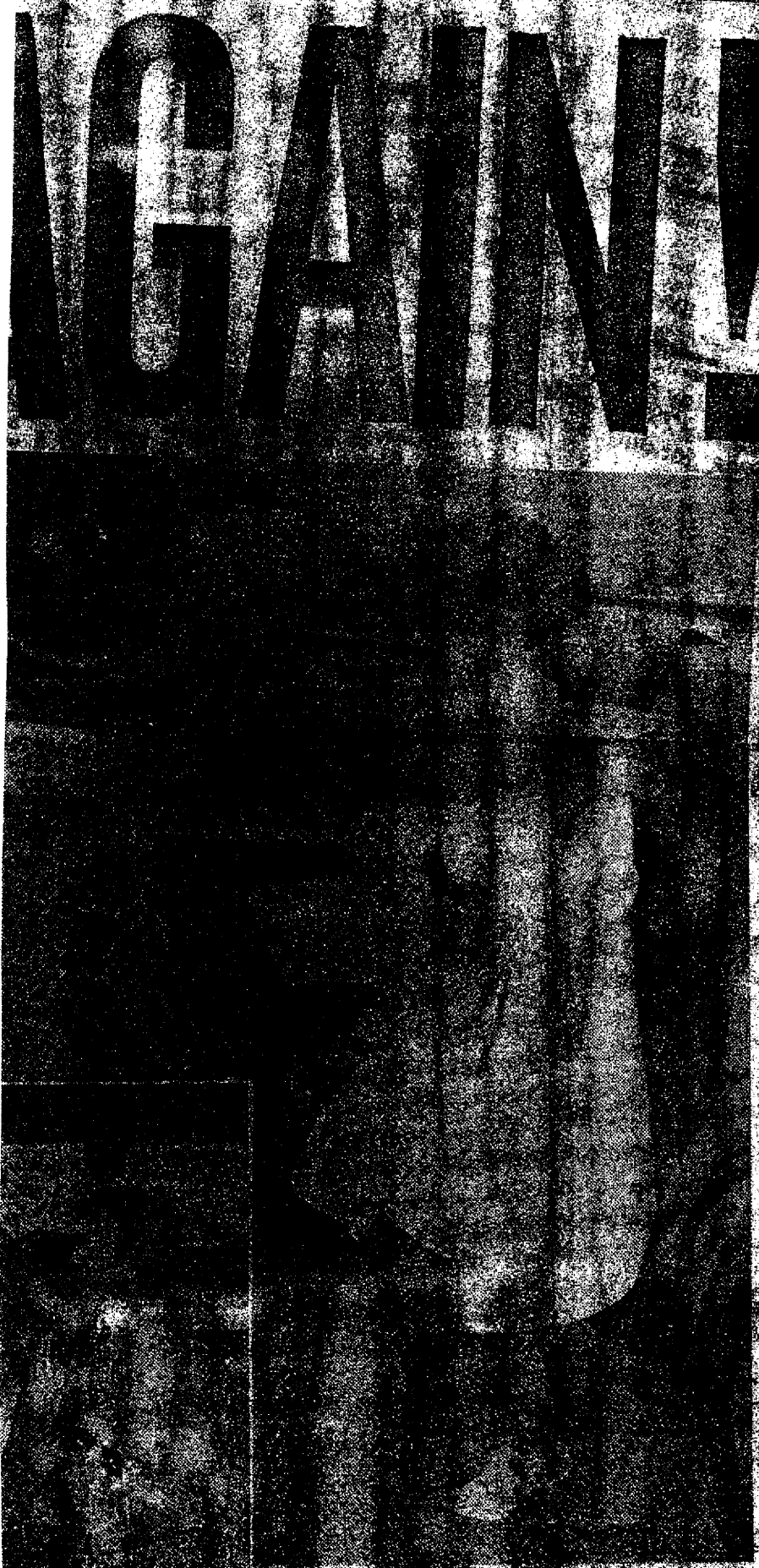
