I was delighted to find in today's mail your envelope with a copy of my Burkeley memorandum and the other material.

Paul, I think that your exchange of letters with Manchester is quite significant. I would like to make two suggestions for your consideration. One, that you should write to Christopher Dedd on Burkeley's change of position with regard to conspiracy, for Dodd's information and if possible for any ideas he may have on exploring this matter further.

Two, that you find out from the Kennedy Library whether or not the materials deposited by Kanchester—and in particular, any transcripts or summaries of his interviews of Burkeley—are new available.

Burkeley, if he was willing even at this late date, to disclose everything he knows about the wounds and the autopsy, could become the vehicle for a very important breakthrough.
