1. Regular broadcast.
2. Cavalcade has just passed the window of their studio.
3. Regular broadcast resumes with music. The time is 26 minutes to 1:00.
4. Regular broadcast interrupted to bring the bulletin that the President and Governor Connally have been shot and rushed to Parkland Hospital.
5. Regular broadcast resumes.
6. Continuation of the bulletin on attempted assassination of President Kennedy and Governor Connally.
7. Regular broadcast resumes.
8. More on shooting - It was not determined immediately whether the Secret Service agents returned the fire. Nor could it be determined whether or not Mrs. Kennedy was injured.
9. Regular broadcast resumes.

22 November 1963

1. Continuation of regular broadcast.
2. Bulletin - Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy is safe and Mrs. Connelly was not hit. The President's mother and father in Hyannis Port have been advised of the shooting.
3. Regular program resumes.
4. Bulletin - President Kennedy has been shot and perhaps fatally wounded. Call went out for specialists, blood was rushed, etc.
5. Continuation of regular broadcast.
6. Bulletin - From UP Dallas - Last sacrament was administered to the President shortly before 1:00. An unidentified Priest said he was still alive at this time.

8. Repeat of the bulletin that President Kennedy is dead.
9. Resume of President Kennedy's assassination.
10. One minute of silence in honor of President Kennedy. Reiteration of shooting of President Kennedy and his activities in Texas.
11. Music.

3. Bulletin from UPI. A Dallas policeman was shot and killed today as he chased a suspected assassin of President Kennedy through a movie theater in the Oak Cliff section. Officer J. D. Tippett was slain as he and a fellow policeman, McDonald, ran into the rear exit of the Texas Theater. Tippett and McDonald had received a tip that the assassin of President Kennedy might have gone into the theater. An usher told them a man in a brown shirt had entered the darkened theater a few moments before. According to police headquarters Tippett fired a shot, McDonald rushed the suspect and the suspect said it is all over now. McDonald and the suspect sprawled over the seat in the theater. McDonald's face was slashed. Police say it was a 4" gash. The suspect was seized.
4. Music resumes.
5. Latest news from UPI. Pat Cunningham reporting - President Kennedy is dead. He was killed by an assassin in Dallas. Governor Connally was wounded by the assassin. Other related news.
6. Vice President Johnson took the oath of office at 1:38 in Dallas.
7. News listed above on Tippett's death.
8. News of the shooting hit Congress like a thunderbolt.
9. President's mother and father were in Hyannis Port when word came.
10. Reactions of the world, to the assassination.
11. Reactions of people on-the-street in London.
12. Vice President Johnson was sworn in as the 36th President at 3:39. He took the oath of office in the compartment of the Presidential Plane in Dallas.

2. Bulletin from UP, Dallas. Police Captain Pat Galloway today said a suspect held in the assassination of President Kennedy was an employee in the building where a rifle was found. Galloway said the suspect had visited Russia, and was married to a Russian. This was not immediately confirmed. The suspect's citizenship was not known. Galloway said the suspect was the same man who shot and killed a city policeman. Policeman J. D. Tippett was slain as he and fellow officer, W. M. McDonald, chased the suspect into a rear exit of the Texas Theater.

3. DFI report that Governor Connally of Texas was hit on the wrist and on the head but that it is not serious. Also had word earlier which was not followed up, that he had to be operated on because of chest wounds. We simply don't know.

4. Music resumes.

22 November 1963

1. Many of the stores in Dallas are closing down because of the assassination.
2. Music resumes.
3. News - The President was assassinated in downtown Dallas. Governor Connally was also seriously wounded. More related news.
4. Report stated that Mr. Kennedy was conscious when he was carried into the hospital and that he lived 30 minutes after he was shot.
5. A Dallas television newsman said he saw a rifle being withdrawn from a window on the fifth or sixth floor of an office building. A rifle was found in the staircase on the building. The rifle had one shot left in the chamber.
6. Police today seized Lee H. Oswald identified as Chairman of a Fair Play for Cuba committee as the prime suspect in the assassination of President Kennedy. Police said Oswald, 24 years old, was accused of the slaying of a Dallas policeman shortly after the shooting of the President. Police Captain Pat Gannaway said the suspect was an employee in the building where a rifle was found.
7. Charles Graham, a 38-year old Dallas man, was standing in the crowd about 15 feet away when the President's car approached. He said Mr. Kennedy was waving and the first shot hit him and that awful look crossed his face.
8. His body was carried from the hospital in a bronze casket and placed in a white hearse. For almost an hour rumors flew around the hospital as to whether the President was alive.

5. Music resumes.
6. Bulletin from Washington. House Speaker McCormick says the President's body will lie in state in the Capitol Rotunda all day Sunday and until noon Monday. The President's body will repose in the White House all day tomorrow.
7. Eulogy for President Kennedy.
8. Many stores will be closed for the remainder of the day and evening in Dallas out of respect for President Kennedy.
9. Music resumes.
