11. Joseph C. Harsh asked Ray Shearer what difference in policy there is going to be now that Lyndon Johnson is President instead of John F. Kennedy. This is being asked in Europe. Shearer answered that this is a difficult question to answer. They had posed that question to some of the leaders and they seem to think there will be no immediate difference in policy. They said that President Johnson is thoroughly familiar with the workings of the Senate and the House. Great continuity of policy.
12. The question was asked whether President Johnson was not more familiar with domestic problems than with foreign affairs. The consensus is that he is not since he has worked so closely with the Foreign Affairs Committee.

15. Cabinet meeting continuing. At 8:00 this evening, President Johnson plans to sit down with the leaders of the Senate and the House.
16. A number of the Cabinet members are not here yet. They are flying back from Japan.
17. Nancy Dickerson, NBC news in Washington, interviewing Senator Yarborough from Texas. Senator Yarborough was in the motorcade in the car immediately behind the President's car. The secret service men were in the car between the President's car and the car in which Vice President and Mrs. Johnson and Senator Yarborough were riding. After the first two shots, the secret service men told the people in the Vice President's car to get down, that something very terrible was happening. The motorcade speeded up and went directly to the hospital at a terrific rate of speed.
18. Senator Yarborough says this is the most terrible thing. He was with the President prior to the motorcade.
19. Comments by Adlia Stevenson about the death of President Kennedy.
20. Lee Harvey Oswald has been questioned for two hours about the two deaths. He has denied any connection with either of the two killings.
21. It is important that so many disagree about how many shots were fired. Report on the condition of Governor Connally.
22. The President's body was brought to Washington in a bronze casket, it will be at Bethesda Naval Hospital all night for an autopsy, which is routine in such official deaths.

The President of Venezuela had been under attack from both right and left wing extremists. Also Castro Communists have made attempts on his life. President Kennedy recently remarked, "You know, I always worry about the President of Venezuela in the possibility he may be assassinated."
5. Morgan Beatty - Mourning of other nations more intense than we thought.
6. Wells Hengan - Bohn, Germany. Erhardt returned from Paris meeting by train, visibly shaken by news of death. Plans to attend funeral.
7. Beatty & Hengan - Conversation about President Kennedy and German relations. Indication that tragedy may bring Western alliance closer together.
8. Morgan Beatty - Repeat of President Johnson's statement upon arrival at Andrews AFB. Erhardt cabled Johnson that West German government and whose nation will stand beside him and the American people.
9. Evidence that Johnson feels the cares of this office he now holds. Haggard and grieved, seemed alone - a man who bears the burden of the presidency.

27. Secret service limitations discussed when protection is needed.

1. James Haggerty, former White House news secretary - No way to completely protect officials. With exception of Cuban attempt on Truman's life in 1950, the only other person to fire on a President that knew anything about firearms was John Wilkes Booth. Assassination was planned, deliberate conspiracy. First time rifle was used.
2. Why is President permitted to ride in open auto? Why does he not ride in a bullet-proof auto? Do you think Secret Service men sufficient surrounding President?
3. Yes, sufficient when augmented by local and State police. Show of force necessary. Secret Service formed at turn of century because people of American tired of having their President shot at. Since it was formed, others have been shot at but regretfully, President Kennedy was the only one of them killed.
4. WBAP - Tom Wayland reporting. Repeat of Dallas Homicide Detective LaVell's statement. Little doubt Oswald killed Officer Tippett. Recap of capture and quote of Oswald's statement. Coincident that Oswald worked in building near where Kennedy shot. Police decline to say if Oswald implicated. Recap of Oswald's history and his life in Russia.

11. Repeat of plane carrying Kennedy's body and when it will arrive in Washington.
12. Dr. Nathan A. Pearlman, Rabbi of the Congregational Emanuel statement on death of President.

13. In Washington - Speaker of the House John MacCormack held conference. Pete Clapper, ABC correspondent - MacCormack, House Majority Leaders Albert and Boggs and Mrs. MacCormack to meet plane with body. MacCormack refused to discuss his new status. MacCormack statement - This nation has suffered the loss of man we sorely needed.
14. Moscow - Sam Jaffee reporting. News came there about an hour ago. Disbelief by all. Extreme confusion. Gromiko reported the news through TASS; Soviet News Agency. Funeral music started over their station.
15. ABC 6 Additional news: Top Treasury Official states "No Secret Service man killed as reported earlier." Report that Dallas Policeman killed believed correct. General John Gearhardt, commander of NORAD, denied Command placed on Alert.
16. WBAP - Station break. Repeat of news of Kennedy assassination during motorcade in Dallas. Also report of Governor Connally being injured by same person. Other related news. Report of Oswald's capture, details on his Russian activities.
17. Repeat of plane bearing body to Washington.
18. ABC - Walter Porges observations on today. Expect to hear memorial to President from St. Patrick's Cathedral. Will bring live report from Andrews AFB upon arrival of the Presidential jet which carries his body. Beginning at 8:00 EST, ABC to present one hour tribute to John F. Kennedy. Then at 9:00 EST to present one hour memorial concert.
19. Bob Fleming - White House. Johnson to make his first trip to White House as president. Body of Kennedy to be taken to Bethesda Naval Hospital where his brother-in-law Sergeant Shriver to be in charge of funeral arrangement. Mrs. Kennedy expected to tell children of their father's death. Silent crowds outside.
20. Senator Hubert Humphrey of Minnesota held conference. Told of mood around White House of terrific shock and grief.

1. Continuation of Senator Humphrey of Minnesota issuing statement. Describes last meeting with President Kennedy. Expresses confidence in Johnson.
2. Assumption statement that Kennedy's body will be taken to the Capitol Building to lie in state in the Rotunda.

4. Don Gardner--ABC News. Report of silent crowds--shock, feeling of hatred and disgust from all ranks of life. In hospitals, the news came like a surgical shock. Doctors and nurses had to administer sedatives.

8. Mexico City--Customs said the Border was closed immediately after Kennedy's death.
9. Netherlands and Britain shocked.
10. ABC--N.Y.--Dr. David Reed, Presbyterian minister asks people to be courageous and ask prayers for Kennedy's family.
11. Dallas--Connally reported in satisfactory condition at Parkland.
12. Chronology of Kennedy's day preceding assassination. Details of shooting and aftermath.
13. Late report from White House. President's body to lay in repose in East Room for viewing by family and officials. Johnson will make statement upon arrival at Andrews AFB. Meeting scheduled later that evening with Secretary of Defense.
14. From Vatican City--Comments by Pope Paul.
15. WBAP--Regular programs cancelled. Local announcements.

16. Don Gardner--ABC--Dallas police have been tipped that this man may have some connection with President Kennedy's assassination. Repeat of finding rifle, shells, etc. in School Book Depository Building.
17. President Lyndon B. Johnson will meet at White House with McNamara and George Bundy--then Congressional leaders.
18. Repeat of announcement of the President lying in state in Rotunda all day Sunday and in the White House on Saturday.
