1. Police Chief Jess Curry says he hasn't been asked to resign. He is noted as one of the outstanding police chiefs in the nation and his resignation would not be accepted anyway. He doesn't expect any of his men to resign either.
2. An interview with Curry discloses he does not plan to resign. Said everyone was doing their job as was expected of them.
3. There is a meeting going on (can't determine where or what kind) but everyone is asked to rice in memory of J.F.K.
4. Attorney General of Texas, Wagner Carr is making a talk, declaring that all facts surrounding the assassination of the President and also of Oswald will be found out and made known to the public. He intends to designate courts of inquiry to delve into these matters and as the developments become known after a complete, thorough and impartial inquiry, all states will have the facts. A full and complete report of the findings of this court of inquiry will be sent to the U.S. Department of Justice. Carr then said he had to catch a plane to Texas to start his plans in operation.
5. Talk of Memorial for President.
6. Art Sinclair talking about arrangements for Lee Oswald. Said there have been no funeral plans made at this time and does not know where the body will be sent.
7. Oswald was considered a left wing extremist.
8. Question as to Ruby's political party. Unknown.
9. Question as to whether Ruby and Oswald were acquainted. Bill DeMar the Carucci M.C. for Ruby said he thought they were.
10. A letter sent to Parkland Hospital was read which had a dollar bill in it and was from Patricia K. Carnichael, Calif. which said-- "Thank you for taking care of the President. I'm sorry he died. Please use this dollar for some other sick person."
11. There is much conversation, quite jumbled, talk of a monument.
12. Governor Connally's conversation is being recorded and he is talking about the shooting and wondering why the President was killed and he wasn't.
