JAMES OUMET stated he is the owner of Century Arms, Incorporated, St. Albans, Vermont.

He stated his records disclose that Italian-made 6.5 mm carbines and rifles have been sold under the name Terni, which name probably means Mannlicher-Terni. He said 6.5 mm Italian rifles designated Mannlicher-Terni or Mannlicher-Carcano are similar in outward appearance. His records further disclose several thousand Italian-made 6.5 mm carbines and rifles had been shipped by his company to various points and all shipments were recorded by serial numbers of the weapons.

These records disclose his company sent a shipment of 6.5 mm Italian carbine rifles to Aldens of Chicago, 5000 West Roosevelt Road, Chicago, Illinois on July 5, 1962. This shipment consisted of 700 rifles and included one such rifle bearing the serial number 2766. This shipment was sent in response to Aldens Order Number 82803.

Records of Century Arms, Incorporated further disclose that the rifle bearing the serial number 2766 was received by Century Arms, Incorporated from Empire Sporting Goods, Montreal, Quebec, Canada. This serial number, 2766, is contained on the invoice prepared by Empire Sporting Goods and this invoice reflects these rifles were known by the trade name Carcano.
