New Attack On Warren Conclusions

NEW YORK (UPI) —The third book in recent months questioning conclusions of the Warren Commission in its inquiry into the assassination of President Kennedy will be published Monday.

Kennedy was murdered on Nov. 22, 1963. Lane said he became interested professionally when he felt that "a concept of instant guilt grew around Oswald as various media simultaneously broadcast the claims of the Dallas police that Oswald was the 'lone assassin.' These words alone encouraged doubt."

Lane wrote an article saying that the Dallas district attorney's evidence, as published, contained "inexplicable contradictions." In December, he got a call from Marguerite Oswald, mother of the dead suspect, saying she had read the article and asking him to represent her son before the commission.
