Warren Report Is Disputed By Three Persons

NEW YORK, Aug. 15.—(AP)—Mark Lane, attorney for Lee Harvey Oswald, who the Warren Commission says assassinated President Kennedy, Monday showed filmed interviews with three assassination witnesses who dispute certain commission findings.

Each witness said he thought the shots that killed Kennedy came from in front of the Presidential motorcade instead of behind, as the Warren report says. One witness said he saw a flash of light or puff of smoke come from a point ahead of the motorcade.

All the witnesses in the film clips testified before the Warren Commission during its official probe of the murder.

The film clips were shown at a news conference in connection with Monday's publication of Lane's book "Rush to Judgment," a critique of the commission's inquiry into the murders of Kennedy, Police Officer J. D. Trippit and Oswald.

The clips were taken from the documentary film, "Rush to Judgment," which is scheduled for September release.
