Jackson, Ex-Foe, Backs Lowenstein Candidacy

LAWRENCE, L. I., Sept. 19—Senator Henry M. Jackson of Washington, who is considered a main contender for the Democratic nomination for President and was a supporter of this country's role in the war in Vietnam, today endorsed the Congressional candidacy of Allard K. Lowenstein, a staunch peace advocate.

"Allard campaigned against me two years ago," Senator Jackson told an audience of 100 Lowenstein supporters at a fund-raising breakfast at the Lawrence Village Park Country Club.

But, the Senator said, "we must mend our fences."

"I hope I'm as effective for him as he was against me," Mr. Jackson said. Later in his 20-minute talk he added: "I don't buy this nonsense that the Democrats have to be divided."

Mr. Lowenstein served one term in the House of Representatives and is now opposing John W. Wydler, the incumbent Republican, in the Fifth Congressional District.
