

Carter Will Name Lowenstein And Mezvinsky to U.N. Posts

WASHINGTON, July 15 (UPI)—President Carter will nominate two former members of Congress—Allard K. Lowenstein and Edward M. Mezvinsky—to posts on the United States delegation to the United Nations, the White House announced today.

Mr. Lowenstein, a former Long Island congressman who was one of the leaders in the movement to oust Lyndon B. Johnson as a Presidential candidate for re-election in 1968, will be named alternate representative for special political affairs, with the rank of ambassador.

Mr. Mezvinsky, a former Iowa Representative who was a member of the House Judiciary Committee during the impeachment proceedings against Richard M. Nixon, will be the American representative on the Human Rights Commission of the Economic and Social Council.

Meanwhile Michael Pistor, a veteran Foreign Service officer, has been named director of public information for the United States Information Agency, its director, John Reinhardt announced today.
