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- 1. Givens status as last men to see Gawald before shorting. See p. 143 of the Warren Report, paragraph one. "Charles Givens, the was the last known employee to see Oswald inside the building prior to the assassination."
- 2. Oswald Dus Trin. Bus is a stronge getaway car. More plausible, however, to have an assassain flee, however inefficiently, then remain on the scene.
- one direct quotations are given on this mage, not merely summary statements. Debris said to have fallen on Williams' head from floor above. They are said to have heard shells striking the floor. Williams, Jarman, and Torman present. Shots are heard, also "the ejecting of the rifle." They go to the fourth floor after the shooting, which is not mentioned in the Warmen Report. It is also 15 minutes until they go down to the street and make a report. Norman later said that the FBI account of the interview with him was incorrect.
- 4. Colice. Sawyer. Fried Unicken found on 5th floor. Chis is at Vol 24. p. 847. Also, an account from KRLD radio, on 11/22/63.
- 5. Routes rublished in the press! Come references to general locations of the motorcade occurred on Notember 19 and 16. In Movember 19, the Dailas Times Sereld gave a correct route for Membed. (The Warren Commission description of these accounts amears on the tom of page 40.) On the maxming of Movember 22, however, the Dailas Morning News printed a mictaken route. This was cut out of the photo of this edition which was reproduced in the Marmen Commission report, however. Questions What was the other coverage of the President's route in the Dailas report from 11/18 to 11/22? Was the innacurate report on 11/22 isolated, or were there other cases of inaccurate reports? (Mix Triplett is checking. 214-522-1897.)

Tre-smably it case wix before the associantion, since Co-wald's name would have been recognized afterward. Twiste as an arrublished Farren Companion exhibit, but does not arrear in any of the Farren Companion volumes.
- 8. <u>Ordered riflo</u>. Some reference to rifle ordered by Stwald which he didn't got, or from an all he didn't see. 36 inch harrel. He exerce not clear.
- 9. Pirmit unlisted mane number. Seference not clear.
- 10. James These. Ther person who was hit by a bullet at the time of the shooting. Whomeoexactly was he located? Fit on the cheek. See Warren Consistence Secret pp. 115-117. Presh sark on the curb an easy to have been caused by a bullet. Third shot may have hit the curb or street. Officer L.L. Cill reports on Tague at 18:40 ret.
- 11. Car end bullet framewis. Car was left oren sutside of Tarkland Scenital evidence may have been lost at this wint. Then taken on the planesse D.C., left at this wint. - 15. Mebeler, in an interview or debate switches on single bullet theory, admits serious mistake on the mart of the Marren Commission.

- 20. <u>Tirrit</u>. Powley, the only one who looked at his watch at the seeme of the Tirrit murder was never interviewed. Reports of time very: 1:07, 1:05, 1:16. Tolice radio call taken.
- 21. Lattimer. Book references are given for sections dealing with the issue of wounds and angles of wounds. See wages 139 and 148. See also, wage 32. A 45 degree downward angle was somehow switched to a 17 degree angle. Slope of the street enters into the calculations. See commission emilbit 903, volume 18, wage 96. \*\*RECONSTRUCTURE CONTROLLED BY BOOKET Cutter. Difficult to follow. Cutter extrapolates the origina of the shots as being the first or second floor, rather than the sixth floor. Seasons but cannot remember who, of hand. Frames 225-236 of the Zapruder file are important in this connection.

- 23. Marksmanshin tests. CBS, out of 37 shots has 17 jams. As car moves, distances range from 175 to 270 feet. (Chandler can't be reached, 516-766-7288) Of the other 20 tests, average time was 5.6 seconds, average number of hits was 1.3. Master marksmen were doing the firing, reports of the test by CBS were considered dishonest. (See Policoff New Times piece.)
- 24. Check cashing issue. Important questions exist on this. When did business close on Friday? Did Wesley Frazier go with Oswald to Irving on day he was supposed to cash check? Was Oswald at the depository that day? Official conclusions are stated without evidence. Why wasn't checkout woman interrogated EXECUTE TO THE TOTAL THE TOTAL
- 25. Oswald arraignment. Was he ever arraigned for the murder of the President? Short charter on this in book. Man was there until 2:30 and says he would have seen if anyone had come in, baraignment time. Didn't see anyone. Arraignment reported at 1:35. No stenographic record kept. No check out or check in alip for Oswald. Implications of this issue extend to collusion on the part of the police, justice of the peach, and district attorney.
- 26. Transfer of Oswald. Transferred because he was ofdicially the prisoner of the county. Newspen are told
  that if they get there by 10:00, they won t miss anything; they therefore assume that he will be gone before
  10:00. How did Ruby get in without collusion? Harl

"Oswald disembarked at La Heure on October 8. He left for inglass that ease day, and arrived on October 9. He told English customs officials in Southernton that he had \$700 and planned to remain in the United Kingdom for one week before proceeding to a school in Switzerland. Was thereas night boat from Le Haven? In fact, Cowald left Angland on the teath rather than the ninth. He left Helsinki on the 15th, and arrived in Hoseow on the 16th. Dosuments relating to Covald's movements at this point are: Commission Exhibit 2711, volume 26, page 39 of the exhibit. Commission Exhibit 946, p. 7, and Commission Exhibit 2676, p. 1. No footnote in Warren Report on how he got to Helsinki. Oswald arrived at Helsinki airport at XXXXX. 11:23 p.m. Not likely to have arrived at the Torni Hotel before Oct. 11, but they might have continued to register early morning arrivals as coming in on the previous day. See volume 26, page 32. (See vol. 26, p. 32. Also see Meagher, pp. 330-331, and vol. 18, p. 162.) & Oswald arrival on 11:33 is on the assumption that he took a direct flight.

How did Oswald get from Southampton to London? (Military flight to Finland is unlikely - would have been from a different airport.) Nothing to back up the fact that he left LeHavre on the 8th, arrived in England on the 9th. (?)

29. Legal Brief. Remarkable document for someone without legal training. Complaint that someone else had used his passport. Underlined reference to the "special training he had received since his discharge." See Meagher, pp. 340-341. See volume 26, pp. 14-17. Parts of the U.S. Code teferred to by Oswald looked up by Schweiker's office. Quotes from his letter citing legal codes or referring to similar notations:

"I must finit (written as #find," - presumably miscopied) out that I have not violated any laws under U.S. Code Section 1544, title 18." p. 16.

"This is a case which comes under the heading: NAVEXOZ 15(e)(4) 1.E., a discharge improperly issued."

"Affirmation of contents of affidavit can be had by contrasting that naval (difficult to make out), office or officer who can give such affirmation of contents, (12(A)NAVEXOS P-70)."

"regardless of the findings of the Board in accordance with paragraph 15(e)5)..."

- 34. FBI performed NAA on bullet fragments. Mentioned nowhere in the Warren Report or documents. Harold Weisberg forced the release of the outcome from the government. No news yet, however, about the interpretation of the results.
