HELEN T. CUNNINGHAM, Employment Counsellor, Texas Employment Commission (TEC), Room 718, 1025 Elm Street, residence 1046 N. Winnetka, telephone WH 2-8923, furnished the following information:

About October, 1962, a Mr. ^{TEOFIL} ANEOPHIL MELLER, an employee of Sanger-Harris, believed to be now employed at the Preston Hollow Store, called her and stated that LEE OSWALD and his wife were in Dallas; that his wife was destitute, and that some organization or person was assisting her. Mr. MELLER, a Polish refugee and a former professor in the University of Krakow, Poland, stated Mrs. OSWALD was a Russian, and that LEE OSWALD needed a job desperately. He asked Mrs. CUNNINGHAM to see LEE OSWALD and Mrs. CUNNINGHAM agreed to do so.

Mrs. CUNNINGHAM stated that according to the records of TEC she saw LEE OSWALD at her office on October 9, 1962. She stated that the Counselling Record Card for LEE OSWALD reflects additional contacts October 10, 11, and 15, 1962. She stated this record also reflects about October 10, 1962, OSWALD was referred to Herrell and Huntington Architects as a messenger at \$1.50 an hour and to Jaggars Printing Company, as a photo-print trainee at \$1.35 an hour.

Mrs. CUNNINGHAM states she cannot be positive whether the contacts of October 10, 11, and 15, 1962, were telephonic or in person. She noted OSWALD had previously been to the TEC at Fort Worth, Texas.
