MR. SANSON WIENER, Proprietor, Wiener Lumber Company, Inwood Road at Maple Avenue, telephone ME 1-1111, who stated he is a member of the Crime Commission in Dallas, furnished a copy of an application for employment dated October 14, 1963, in the name of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, born October 18, 1939, place not given, which was filled out in his handwriting. WIENER stated that he was mildly impressed with OSWALD as a prospective employee until OSWALD was asked to show his Honorable Discharge Card, inasmuch as he alleged to have been in the U. S. Marine Corps. When he was unable to satisfy him regarding his alleged former service with the U. S. Marine Corps, he was not hired, according to MR. WIENER.

MR. WIENER advised that one of his employees advanced the theory that OSWALD may not have come to WIENER Lumber Company purely by accident, that it was entirely possible that a motorcade from Love Field to downtown Dallas could have passed by this lumber company at Inwood Road and Maple Avenue. WIENER pointed out that in his opinion it would have possibly been even a more direct route to the downtown area than the route which was taken subsequently by the Presidential Motorcade when President KENNEDY visited Dallas. He felt that the possibility existed that LEE HARVEY OSWALD may have contacted other places on what he may have thought to have been a potential motorcade route from the airport to downtown Dallas for the President.
