M. L. BAKER, patrolman, Dallas Police Department, Dallas, Texas, advised that he went into the building of the Texas School Book Depository shortly after President KENNEDY had been shot on November 22, 1963. He said that he and Mr. ROY TRULY, manager, observed LEE HARVEY OSWALD on the second floor of the building. He stated he asked TRULY who that was and TRULY told him OSWALD was all right, that he worked in the building. He stated they proceeded on up the stairs and did not see OSWALD any more until after his arrest by the Dallas Police Department. BAKER stated he had not seen OSWALD before and did not know him. He stated that neither did he know JACK RUBY other than he had heard of him in the past. He stated he knew of no social connections or activities of RUBY and he had no information that RUBY and OSWALD were acquainted with each other.
