GUN TESTS DELAYED IN '68 KENNEDY DEATH

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 31 (UPI)—A county judge postponed at least three weeks today a decision on whether additional tests were needed to determine if more than one gun was fired during the Robert F. Kennedy assassination seven years ago.

Judge Robert Wenke of Superior Court, presiding postponed his decision after hearing nearly three hours of arguments by attorneys for

Paul Schrade, one of five persons injured during the shooting that killed Mr. Kennedy in the pantry of the Ambassador Hotel in June, 1968.

A panel of seven independent experts told Judge Wenke more than two months ago that there was "no substantive or demonstrable evidence" to indicate that a second gun had been used to fire any of the bullets examined by the panel members.

But Mr. Schrade has filed a personal injury suit against Mr. Kennedy's killer, alleging that more than one gun could have been fired.
