## **DR. KING TOLD B.B.C. THOUGHTS ON DEATH**

LONDON, April 5—“I live every day under the threat of death, and I have no illusions about it,” the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said in an interview broadcast by the British Broadcasting Corporation a few hours before his murder yesterday.

Dr. King was interviewed by the B. B. C. Washington correspondent, Gerald Priestland. The half-hour program was prepared in December but broadcast for the first time anywhere last night.

Mr. Priestland asked Dr. King whether he had “moments of apprehension that you might meet a violent death.”

“I don't have any apprehension about it, I'm very realistic about it and, I guess, philosophical,” Dr. King replied.
