

## May Seek Bail for Ailing Ruby

HARTFORD, Conn., Dec. 16 (AP)—If doctors of Jack Ruby, slayer of Lee Harvey Oswald, declare Ruby is "in bad shape" because of cancer, Ruby's team of appellate lawyers may attempt to get him out of prison on bail.

William M. Kunstler of New York City, one of five members of Ruby's defense team, said yesterday he expects to attend a lawyers' conference this weekend to plan bail procedure.

Kunstler, who spoke at a meeting of the greater Hartford chapter of the Connecticut Civil Liberties Union, listed Ruby as "one" of several of his clients whose cases test basic constitutional issues.

Kunstler said he is leaving for Bimini Island in the Bahamas to meet another client, Rep. Adam Clayton Powell to discuss the defense of Powell's right to be seated in Congress.

Kunstler said he recently represented Powell in a federal action to stop Powell from being certified as congressman on the grounds that the Harlem representative was not a resident of his district. "I tried that case, and I won," Kunstler said.
