

JFK Book May Go to Libraries

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13 (UPI)—The U. S. Information Agency may put copies of William Manchester's controversial book about the assassination of President Kennedy into its libraries abroad.

USIA Director Leonard H. Marks said yesterday the decision would be made after reviewers have read copies of "The Death of a President," which some persons have claimed is critical of President Johnson.

In a copyrighted interview in U. S. News & World Report, Marks noted that the USIA already has carried "an adequate summary of the main points in the Manchester book" and the controversy it has aroused in news stories for broadcast and publication abroad.
