Kennedy Death Facts 'Secret'

One third of the official reports that led to the Warren Commission report on the late President Kennedy's death have been classified as secret, a New York attorney said here yesterday.

"All of the evidence should be made available for objective analysis," said lawyer Mark Lane, author of a recently published book on the assassination, "Rush to Judgment."

Lane said about 500 of the more than 1500 reports, now in the National Archives in Washington, D.C., are restricted material to be made public in 75 years. The time was chosen because it is

longer than the average life span, he added.

The attorney contended that there were many contradictions between the published commission report and the 26 volumes of evidence also published. And both leave many questions unanswered, he said.

Lane spent two years working on the book, and is now working on a documentary film, also named "Rush to Judgment," which will support his contention, he said.

He is here for a week of radio and television interviews.

"There should be no need for mystery," he said. "I'm going to stay with this until I get the facts or find them impossible to obtain."
