U.S. Should Get All Facts About Kennedy's Death

THE GARRISON, district attorney for New Orleans Parish, subpoenaed the archivist of the United States to produce the photographs and X-rays taken during the autopsy of John F. Kennedy. (There are 45 photos and 24 X-rays that have never been seen.)

Garrison's office says that it has "substantial evidence" that President Kennedy was killed in a crossfire of bullets by a team of men. The subpoena says the photos and X-rays will reveal the fact that the late President was struck from three different directions.

Americans should want this data reviewed by competent medical examiners and investigators. Without it, and other things revealed to show every good bone of the Warren Report is mere conjecture. Criminal District Court Judge Edward Haggerty Jr., who will preside over the Shaw trial in New Orleans, signed the subpoena. The data should be released and America should get about learning the full story, no matter where the chips fall.
