

Haiti Acts On 'Plotter'

PORT AU PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — The Haitian government has stripped consular privileges from Oswald Brandt, a multimillionaire accused of plotting to overthrow President Francois (Papa Doc) Duvalier.

A Foreign Ministry statement said Brandt, 78, had never actually received official credentials as consul here for Jamaica. Brandt is a Jamaican citizen and British subject with holdings in the Caribbean estimated at \$20,000,000.

Brandt has been imprisoned here for a week on charges that he supplied \$150,000 toward an unsuccessful invasion by Haitian rebels May 20. Brandt has denied the charges.

The Foreign Ministry removed Brandt's consular status after the Jamaican government sought his release on the contention that as consul he was exempt from arrest. Brandt's

title of honorary Greek consul was also revoked, the ministry said.

Brandt's son, Clifford, a Haitian employe of the Brandts and two prominent attorneys are also under arrest in the case.

Hong Kong Paper Reports Many Die in China Clashes

HONG KONG (Reuters)—Several hundred persons have been killed in clashes at Wuchow in the Chinese southern province of Kwangsi, the South China Morning Post reported today.

Many of the dead were dropped into a river flowing into the Pearl River Delta, according to travelers from China quoted by the English-language newspaper.
