SPECK IS MOVED FROM CHICAGO HOSPITAL TO JAIL

CHICAGO, July 30 (AP) — Richard Speck, indicted in the murder of eight student nurses, spent has first night in Cook county jail after being confined in a hospial since his arrest July 17.

Speck, 24 years old, was transferred yesterday from the House of Correction hospital to the jail. The hospital called a conference to ask for co-operation of news media in preventing any incident.

Dr. William N. Norcross, the city jail chief surgeon, told reporters that "the events surronding the transfer of a maximum security prisoner in Dallas were regrettable."

"The pride and interest of Chicago would not be served if the incident were repeated," he said, referring to the killing of Lee Harvey Oswald, named by the Warren Commission as the assassin of President John F. Kennedy.

Speck was immediately placed in the jail infirmary. Warden Jack Johnson said Speck "is docile, and is following orders. He is no problem at all."
